#### Mō tēnei tūranga mahi | About the Role

The Population Health Clinical Pharmacist provides supports best practice medicine utilisation, supporting our Ka Hikitia strategy. These goals relate to the provision of best practice, high quality support that meets the needs of the population, prioritising Māori, Pacific and other priority population groups.

Key responsibilities include:

- To promote medicines safety and quality use of medicines through:
  - Analysis of prescribing for variation focusing on equity for Māori and other priority populations.
  - Providing information and evidence-based advice to primary care about the wise, safe effective and equitable use of medicines
  - Developing and implementing quality improvement initiatives focusing on equity for Māori and other priority populations.
- Being the key advisor on the implementation and management various pharmacy services.
- Leading projects relating to the sustainability and equitable access of pharmacy services.
- Collaborating on the development of primary care workforce education.

#### Ngā pūkenga me ngā wheako | Skills and Experience

This role is suited to those who have proven health experience in Primary Care. It is critical that you be a champion of improving health outcomes for Māori and other priority populations in our community. Having a good knowledge of the Primary and Community Health Care Sector is important, as is being able to manage complex relationships and projects. Experience in supporting innovation and change within health is also required.



In addition, you will have:

- A postgraduate qualification in Clinical Pharmacy, and be a registered pharmacist in New Zealand
- A sound knowledge of the Te Tiriti o Waitangi and be an advocate of our Ka Hikitia strategy
- Demonstrated knowledge of current best practice in use of medicines and of major health issues confronting Hawke's Bay
- A strong drive to achieve results and be a proactive self-starter
- Proven relationship building skills with other health professionals
